Get Out and Bike!

There are several places to enjoy riding your Amtryke bike with your family in the Miami Valley. If you are looking for a short bike path or the chance to take a long scenic bike ride, check out www.miamivalleytrails.org website. Another great website that provides more information on bike paths and trails is www.buckeyetrail.org. The Buckeye Trail, North Country Trail, and the Great Miami Recreational Trail all are beautiful ways to connect with the great outdoors of Miami County with your Amtryke and family. Take a bike ride from Tipp City to Piqua, all on one continuous bike path with stops along the way. You may also enjoy taking your Amtryke to Duke Park (Troy), Kyle Park (Tipp City), or Linear Park (Piqua) for a short ride around the parks, in addition to spending time having a picnic, playing on the playgrounds, or relaxing. Get out and bike! There is so much to explore and enjoy in the outdoors of Miami County!

4th Annual "I Can" Tri-athlon Event

Miamibucs is gearing up for the fourth annual "I Can" Tri-athlon event in 2019. This adapted triathlon designed for children ages 4-14 with different abilities will be held at the Troy Aquatic Park on July 21, 2019. The race will start at 11:30, immediately following the Troy Kids Triathlon. Participants will complete two laps in the pool, bike or tryke in the Hobart Arena parking lot, and then finish for the walk/run/walker/gait trainer/wheelchair portion of the race at the Troy High School Memorial Stadium. The race course is adapted to meet the needs of each participant, and 2 volunteers are required to help meet the needs of each participant. Volunteers and trykes will be available for those in need, and a doctor will be on premises during the event.

The cost is \$25 per participant, which includes a goodie bag and T-shirts for the participant and volunteers. Proceeds for the "I Can" Tri-athlon benefit Miamibucs, a non-profit organization that provides Amtrykes for children and adults with disabilities who live in Miami County. Winterizing and Storing Your Bike

- * Wipe down your bike (check for frame cracks, etc.)
- * Clean your chain, then lubricate chain as well as brakes & shifting cables (few drops of light lubricant on a rag to rub on exposed cable and very lightly work through cable housing)
- * Remove water bottles
- * Remove electronic devices (speedometer, GPS, etc.)
- * Fully inflate and wipe down tires. Check your wheels for loose or broken spokes and spin the wheels; if your wheels do not spin straight it's probably time to get your bike in for a service
- + Inspect brake pads to look for excessive wear
- * Storing your bike inside and hanging it from the ceiling/wall is best ... if you're unable to hang it, just turn it upside down to get the weight off your tires
- * If you must store your bike outside, be sure to lubricate the chain, turn it upside down (unless it has hydraulics or suspension system) and cover it with a tarp. Avoid storing your bike in direct sunlight

How We Began

AMBUCS was founded in 1922 by an engineer who wanted to start a national service organization for young business and professional men. After selling two million turpentine cups, William White had enough money to form the first American Business Club in Birmingham, Alabama. Their motto was *Shoulders Together* to encapsulate its concept that great things can be accomplished when many members each give a small amount of time and talents.

In the early 1990s, Sue Hayward, a pediatric physical therapist, desired for each of her kids to have a tryke of their own, that was specially adapted for them. Members of the Longview, Texas AMBUCS chapter volunteered their time and skills to build trykes for them, then for others, free of charge. The Longview chapter took their tryke project to the National AMBUCS conference and was voted by AMBUCS to take on the Amtryke project as a national project.

The Miamibucs Chapter of the National AMBUCS, INC. is a local chapter of AMBUCS. It is a 501C3 organization which was chartered on July 31, 2015. The organization was started by physical and occupational therapists in Miami County to provide the children they serve with tricycles to enhance their development.
